On Sunday, March 29 from 5:30pm to 6pm, Cultural Caravan TV presents a Women's History Month Special in commemoration of the life and legacy of Harriet Ross Tubman. This episode was taped on location in the beautiful Finger Lakes Region of Auburn, New York. There in 1859, Harriet Tubman purchased land from then Senator William Seward which was converted into a home for the aged, as well as a residence and barn. *Harriet Tubman was known as the "Moses" of her people and was responsible for liberating many people from slavery by following the North Star.* In 2013, we commemorated the 100th anniversary of her death.

In this episode, we will highlight the abolitionist movement in New York State and the relationship that Harriet had with the Seward family towards these efforts. This program, *hosted by Dr. William Seraile*, provides fascinating insight into the life and legacy of this great African American freedom fighter.
