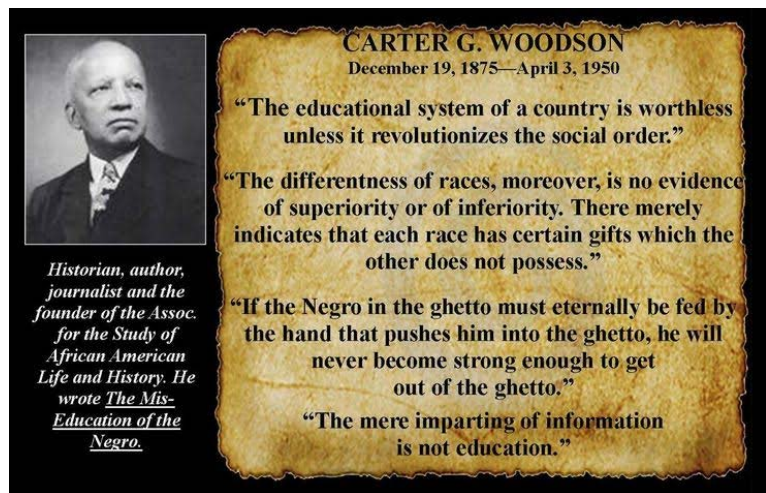

Carter Godwin Woodson (December 19, 1875 – April 3, 1950) was an African-American historian, author, journalist and the founder of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH). ***This year marks the***

101th anniversary of ASALH. Dr. Woodson was one of the first scholars to study African-American history. His organization, ASALH, still continues the mission to education and enlighten all people about the wealth of contributions made by people of African ancestry to the world.
