Dr. Newton has won many awards and citations including Essence Magazine's "Woman of the Year in Health & Medicine. She has worked internationally with psychiatrists and other health care providers in Africa, South America, the Caribbean as well as here in the USA, pioneering techniques for the chronic mentally ill and cultural competency relative to culturally competent mental health delivery globally in HIV/AIDS. Her innovations include culturally competent holistic treatment in chemical dependency and prevention having her work embraced internationally in Africa, the Caribbean and in Great Britain with a community based clinic named in her honor there. Dr. Newton is an internationally acclaimed lecturer and published author of several articles and books.
